AJ Schwartz of the EPD was the presenter for the continuation of this meeting series.

Individual Community Zoning Maps:

AJ went over the Regional Overlay and its uses on maps. These areas were highlighted in orange. Some real life examples were used in the townships. Overlays are considered a very logical tool. Airports are highlighted in light blue and dark blue. The light blue would govern building height in these areas. Special conditions and exceptions can also be added to the Regional Overlay. This can be a helpful tool for Zoning Hearing Boards.

Draft Land Uses:

Went over CULU (Commonly Unwanted Land Uses) by number and the list for each township. A hand out was given to each township with the master list of land uses. Some items on the list would serve a larger region. An example would be an asphalt factory. It can possibly serve a few townships.

Lot Size and Open Space Discussion:

AJ presented some actual cases in the PA Case Law for real life examples. Townships had a discussion of how lot size worked and if anything needed to be updated.

Official Map Work Status:

Environmental Protection Overlay should work within the Ordinances. Density can be changed for each type of land use. Farmland preservation in Lehigh County would work by soil type and can be considered a conservation district.

Next Steps:

Townships have to work on their official maps and its environmental protection sections before the next meeting.
